Dear Members of the University,

Up to now, all Tower 7 residents, except one household who is still waiting, have received negative COVID-19 test results.

The CMA mobile lab has completed its three days of operation on campus. Beginning from late afternoon last Thursday (4 Mar), through Friday and today, altogether more than 400 staff and students have used Prof Wen Weijia's rapid PCR screening test. So far all test results have been negative.

The Government has announced earlier today the COVID-19 vaccination priority groups have been extended to cover, among others, teachers and school staff https://www.info.gov.hk/gia/general/202103/08/P2021030800738.htm, and university faculty and staff are included. Beginning from 9 am tomorrow (9 Mar), colleagues can book online for a time slot at one of the Community Vaccination Centres (CVC) https://booking.covidvaccine.gov.hk/forms/index.jsp for either one of the two available vaccines, completely free of charge.
